

THE GOLDEN PEGLEG AWARD



Henk Rogers '72 is an internationally-renowned entrepreneur and video game developer, widely recognized for his contributions to the gaming industry and his advocacy for sustainable energy solutions.

Henk's career in computer gaming began three decades ago when he revolutionized Japan's video game industry and created "The Black Onyx," Japan's first role-playing game. However, he is best known as the man who turned a little-known game called Tetris into an international phenomenon. The story of his high-stake negotiations with the Soviet Union and Nintendo is the subject of new Apple TV+ blockbuster, "Tetris."

A near-fatal heart attack in 2005 led Henk to discover his true missions in life and he has since dedicated his career to the research, development and implementation of renewable energy sources in his home state of Hawaii and around the world. Today, Henk is the founder of 10 companies and non-profit organizations focused on renewable energy, space exploration, and ending the use of fossil fuels on Earth.

His Blue Planet Foundation led efforts to pass the nation's first 100% renewable energy law, mandating that the State of Hawaii achieve 100% renewable energy for electricity by 2045. His newest initiative the Blue Planet Alliance is expanding his foundation's successful playbook around the world, helping island nations adapt to clean energy sources.

Rogers is also the founder of Blue Planet Energy, a global leader in renewable energy storage systems, and the International Moonbase Alliance, an organization with the goal to build sustainable settlements on the Moon and Mars.

THE YOUNG PEGLEG AWARD




Nina Uzoigwe '17 is an MD/PhD candidate within the NIH Medical Scientist Training Program at NYU Grossman School of Medicine. She was born and raised in Brooklyn, NY and went to Stuyvesant High School, where she was an active researcher in Stuy's Regeneron Program and served as the Black Student League's President as well as an Alto I Section Leader for Stuyvesant's Chorus.

After capturing national attention for being accepted to seven Ivy League schools, Nina Uzoigwe graduated from Harvard University '21 as a John Harvard Scholar (awarded to the top 5% of her class) and concentrated in Bioengineering with a Secondary in Global Health and Health Policy. Her senior thesis, which won the Thomas T. Hoopes Prize examined pulmonary valve replacement in neonates with congenital heart defects at Boston Children's Hospital. This work additionally received the Dean's Award in Bioengineering, which is the highest honor bestowed to students within the S.B. Engineering Program. While at Harvard, she also served as an EMT and a health peer advising liaison, aiding the student campus and Cambridge community at large, and she volunteered as a mentor at Science Club for Girls at a nearby elementary school.

Her love for cultivating genuine excitement, confidence, and literacy in STEM for young scholars within underrepresented communities did not stop there. She is a Co-Founder and Executive Director of RISE UP, a four week summer program funded by the Perlmutter Cancer Center at NYU Langone Health that is centered around lab research immersion and augmented by clinical experiences focused on building scientific skills and career development in young underrepresented minorities in medicine. Through her practice as a surgeon-scientist, she hopes to continue to spearhead efforts in bridging gaps in education so URMs are inspired to become powerful influencers of tomorrow in their respective fields.

THE OUTSTANDING TEACHER AWARD



James "Jim" Lonardo has taught at Stuyvesant since 1984. A well-loved Tech teacher, he has also served as Senior Coordinator, Coordinator of Technology, and faculty advisor for the yearbook, *The Indicator*.

In 2003, he became the coach of Stuyvesant's award-winning FIRST Robotics Team. While he initially only wanted to facilitate logistics, he eventually brought his expertise in technical drawing and CAD to the students. Without his skills, the team's robot would have never accomplished as much as it has today.

During the past two decades, Mr. Lonardo has been volunteering overtime so that the team's engineering division can build the best robot. He literally goes the extra mile by driving the robot to and from the NYC Regional each year, alongside organizing all essential forms. Without Mr. Lonardo, the team wouldn't even be able to compete!

According to Jim, his favorite part of being their coach is "giving [them] a hard time—I mean, working with [them]." The team members appreciate him as an older friend, who makes them laugh by claiming he forgot to register for a regional or that they got red-carded. His lightheartedness reinforces his belief that their ultimate goal lies not in winning, but to reap the benefits competitions bring them—teamwork and a positive learning experience.

To commemorate his almost 40 years of teaching at Stuyvesant and 20 years of mentoring the team, StuyPulse's robot this year, "Jim", is named after him!
